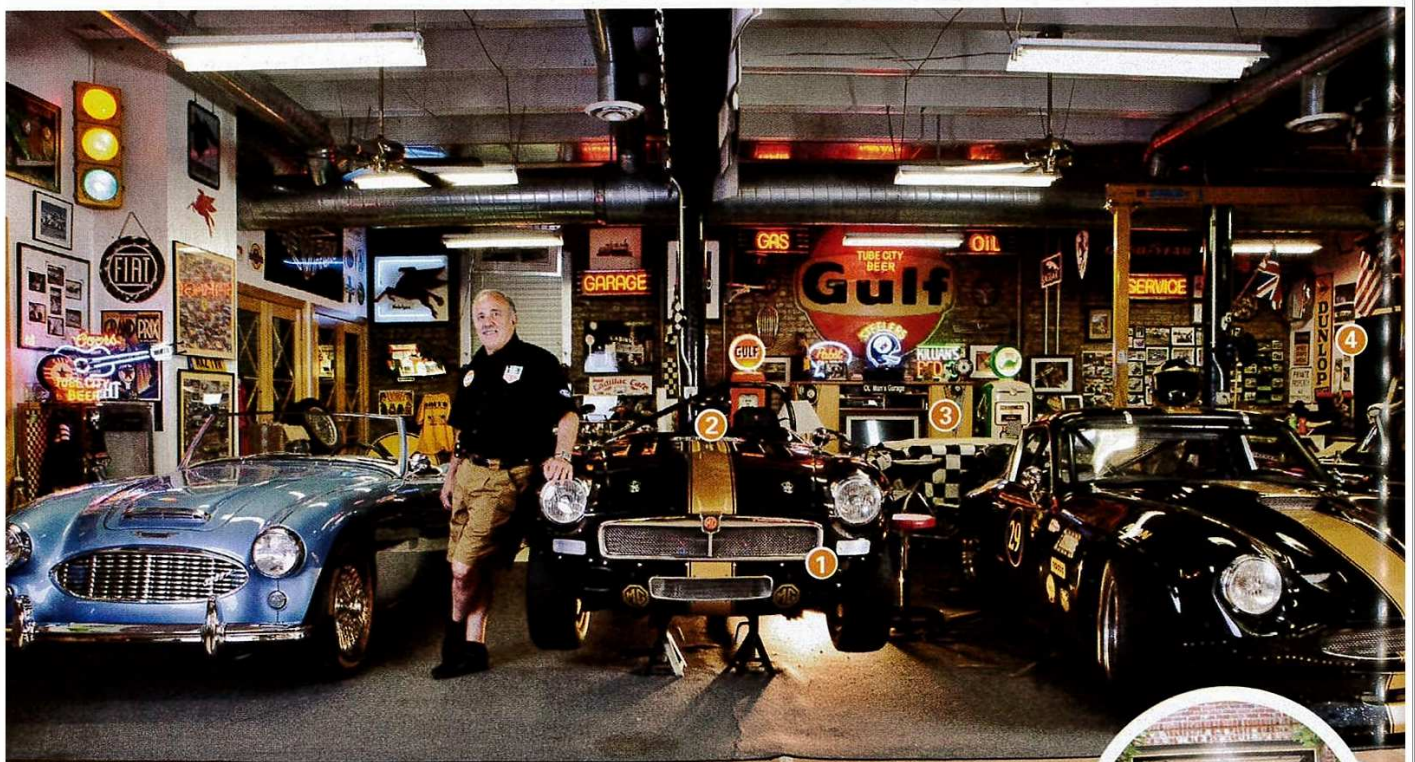


RACE TRACK REMNANTS
